1) Control of children away from home, on a journey, in a different environment. 2) Travel on aircraft and travel through local & foreign airports. Possible loss of students in airports & security risks.	Teachers, students and other travelers. 3) Coach and minibus accidents involving schools and youth groups. Road traffic accidents are an on-going risk.
